## SCR runs 13 more Shramik Specials trains to the North from Telangana and Andhra Pradesh

The South Central Railway (SCR) has run as many as 13 'Shramik Special' trains - 11 from Telangana and two from Andhra Pradesh (A.P.), carrying up to 13,533 migrant labourers towards the northern States starting Tuesday night till the early hours of Wednesday. # Coronavirus: Andhra Pradesh govt to set up Rs 200 Cr fund for MSMEs

The Andhra Pradesh government is creating a Rs 200-crore fund to help micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs), which contribute about eight percent to the gross state domestic product, overcome

The liquidity crisis caused by the COVID-19 lockdown. Under this, MSMEs would be extended loans from Rs 2 lakh to Rs 10 lakh each without collateral security and with a six-month repayment holiday, according to Special Chief Secretary, Industries and Commerce, Rajat Bhargava.
