

2nd Edition of Digital Rajasthan Conclave

23 August 2017: Jaipur

The 2nd edition of Digital Rajasthan Conclave was organised on 23 August 2017 at Jaipur. The programme was jointly organised by FICCI and STPI.

Shri Rajpal Singh Shekhawat, Hon'ble Minister for Industry, Government of Rajasthan was the Chief Guest for the programme. He said that owing to IT and digitalization, life is not only changing fast but is also ensuring quality employment, good governance and financial inclusion. He emphasized on the fact that it was of paramount importance that the prosperity and happiness should be key factors that this change is bringing about.

Ms Mugdha Sinha, Managing Director, RIICO Ltd said that even the 'have nots' are now using technology as is evident from the use of paytm and other such tools. She said that only 27% in urban areas and only 4% in rural areas are using digital technology today. This number has to increase to make it more effective.

The Director General, Software Technology Parks of India, Dr Omkar Rai said that STPI registered units in Rajasthan have software exports to the tune of Rs 1000 crores. He said that IT sector accounts for 7.7% of the total GDP of India and initiatives likes 'Make in India', 'Digital India', 'Startup India', will further boost the IT industry in India.



Release of Theme Paper on "Transforming Lives through Technology"

A theme paper on 'Transforming Lives through Technology', prepared by Ernst & Young LLP (E&Y), was also released during the Conclave. The report focused on the potential opportunities for Governments to aid their digital enablement programs. The report also talks about growing areas in which newer technologies and business models can explored by the Government. This will in turn ensure improvement in service delivery and efficiency in providing benefits to the citizens.

The Conclave featured Sessions on Digitalization as instrument for effective governance, public service delivery driving investments, employability & growth and Accelerating the Digital Transition: Emerging Trends.

In conjunction to India Stonemart, 2nd edition of Jaipur Architecture Festival was also organised. The Council of Architecture (CoA) and Indian Institute of Architects (IIA) were Knowledge Partners.

Over 16500 sq meters net exhibition area with 453 exhibitors from 11 countries and 16 states of India participated at the exhibition. There were overseas pavilions from Turkey, China, Italy, Iran, etc; participation from Spain, Croatia, Greece, UAE, etc; state pavilions from Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Odisha and Jharkhand. 9th Great Indian Travel Bazaar (GITB)

23 - 25 April 2017: Jaipur

The 9th edition of The Great Indian Travel Bazaar was organised by Department of Tourism, Government of Rajasthan; Ministry of Tourism, Government of India and Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) at Jaipur.

The event was supported by Hotels & Restaurant Association of Rajasthan (HRAR), Indian Heritage Hotels Association (IHHA) and Rajasthan Association of Tour Operators (RATO).

Over the years GITB has emerged as one of the most important travel marts for inbound tourism. The two-day event witnessed fruitful networking giving further boost to the travel trade business in the State.

During the Inaugural Session, Mr N C Goel, Addl Chief Secretary – Tourism, Government of Rajasthan stated that the development of tourism infrastructure in Rajasthan is being given high priority in terms of new tourism products including new circuits in the state. Mr Goel mentioned that the State has already submitted proposals to the Union Tourism Ministry to the tune of Rs. 500 crores for developing innovative circuits like Spiritual, Heritage, Mega Desert, Tribal and Eco-Adventure.

Mr Suman Billa, Joint Secretary - Tourism, Government of India said that there has been an impressive growth of foreign tourist arrivals in the country to the tune of 11% and around 9% in domestic tourist arrivals in 2016. He said that a primary reason for a quantum jump in the tourist arrivals was also owing to the electronic visa facility.

Dr Jyotsna Suri, Chairperson, FICCI Tourism Committee said that the Great Indian Travel Bazaar is the most significant platform and the sole promoter of Inbound Tourism in India.

Two knowledge papers entitled 'Rajasthan – Revelation Beyond the Obvious' prepared by FICCI and MRSS as well as 'India Inbound Tourism – The Next Growth Trajectory' prepared by FICCI and YES Bank were released by Smt Krishnendra Kaur (Deepa), Hon'ble Minister of State for Tourism, Art & Culture, Government of Rajasthan.

The programme went off very well with 10,800 pre-fixed B2B meetings between buyers and sellers; 275 leading inbound foreign tour operators from around 53 countries; 288 Indian sellers including Tour Operators, Hotels, Resorts, Spa & Wellness, International Airline and State Tourism Boards.







6th VASTRA

VASTRA, an international garment and apparel fair, was jointly organised by Rajasthan State Industrial Development and Investment Corporation Ltd (RIICO) and Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI). VASTRA has created a niche for itself in textiles and apparel industry since its inception in 2012.

Smt Smriti Zubin Irani, Hon'ble Union Minister for Textiles and Information & Broadcasting, Government of India was the Chief Guest for VASTRA 2017. During her inaugural address she mentioned that Textile industry in the country is growing exponentially with the Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) having tripled in 3 years. It has touched the figure of USD 618.95 million in 2016-17. However, there is still a huge potential for further growth in the sector for which multifarious efforts are being made by the Centre as well as different States.

On the occasion, Shri Rajpal Singh Shekhawat, Hon'ble Minister for Industry, Government of Rajasthan said that Rajasthan is a prominent textile destination in the country. Textile industry of Rajasthan is present across the entire textile value addition chain – from spinning to garments and made-ups.

Business Fashion Shows were organised on all the three days by the leading designers of the State. VASTRA 2017 witnessed the presence of over 250 exhibitors from 13 States, around 300 overseas buyers from more than 50 countries and representatives from around 100 Indian Buying Houses / Agents.

With the aim of Regenerating Agriculture through Smart Agriculture Marketing Solutions to Double Farmers' Income, FICCI in association with Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare organized the National Agri Marketing Summit.

The Summit was an initiative to provide a common platform to all relevant stakeholders, including government officials, agribusiness companies, mandi boards, financial institutions, farmer producer organizations and academicians to come together and review the growth trajectory of the agriculture marketing in the country.

Government of Rajasthan participated as partner state in the Summit.
