 - Voluntary action
 - Corporate and industry level
 - Promotes water efficiency
- One next step towards water security
 - Cross-sector
 - Benefits at basin level
 - Ambition that reflects policy objectives and/or community needs

- Competing demands for water
 - Reformed WUAs (France)
 - Multi-purpose infrastructures (France)
- Prices
 - Voucher for WSS (Chile)
 - Recycling revenues to invest in water efficiency
- Harmful subsidies
 - Tarifa 9 (Mexico)
- Policy coherence
 - National (energy) vs local (agriculture)(Brazil)
- Scale
 - Water Pact (Brazil)

From stewardship to water security The political economy of reform

- Barriers to water policy reforms
 - No clear case for change
 - Vague understanding of winners and losers
 - Lack of references
- National policy dialogues
 - A political process
 - Informed by international good practice
 - Fuelled by economic analysis
