Taking Healthcare Close to Home 14th July 2019 at Hotel Palmrya Grand Suite, Tirunelveli

FICCI in association with Health Department, Government of Tamil Nadu supported by IMA-Tirunelveli organized the 1st edition of TANCARE 2019 held on 14th July 2019 at Hotel Palmrya Grand Suite, Tirunelveli which was inaugurated by **Tmt. Shilpa Prabhakar Satish I.A.S., Collector and District Magistrate, Tirunelveli District** wherein more than 80 senior stakeholders participated from Healthcare Industry across Southern Tamil Nadu.
