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Tripura – An overview

- Tripura is a small North Eastern State having 10,491 sq km area
- It has 8 districts having approx. 37 lakhs population
- Agartala is the capital city of the state
- The landscape of the state is of hilly-forest nature
- Basic mode of transport are Road, Rail and Air

Transport in Tripura

- Before 2016, the basic mode of transport was Road transport
- Present NH 8 was the only lifeline of Tripura
- Since 2016, BG Rail service started
- The state is connected from North to extreme South with Lumding-Badarpur Section
- There are 19 train services from Agartala to various cities of the country on daily basis
- Agartala airport is the only operational airport in the state
- Kailasahar, Khowai and Kamalpur airport are the 3 non operational airports of the state
- One helicopter under MHA scheme is in operation in the state

MBB Airport at Agartala

- MBB airport is the only operational airport of the State
- It is the 2nd biggest Airport in N. E Region in respect of Passanger Traffic after the Guwahati Airport
- A new integrated terminal building (NITB) is constructed and inaugurated on 04.01.2022 in this airport
- This NITB has a capacity of handling 1200 pax at a time
- Agartala (Capital city of Tripura) Chittagong (Bangladesh) international flight shall soon be operated in this route under International UDAN
- MBB airport is declared as Customs Check Post for the purpose
- Very soon, MHA is going to declare it as Immigration check post

- ➤ Aerial distance from Agartala to Chittagong 176 km
- >State Government sanctioned **VGF** amount of **Rs.15 Cr.** for operation of flight on Agartala-Chittagong
- route
- >State Govt. released **Rs.3.85 Cr.** out of Rs.15.00 Cr
- >AAI issued LOA to "MS Spicejet" for operation of flights

Kailasahar Airport

- Kailasahar airport (77.085 acres) is situated at Unokoti District
- During pre-independence period Kailashahar Airport was connected by Bayudoot Airlines with Kolkata
- Presently, Kailashahar Airport has been declared as RCS Airport which may be connected with Agartala – Silchar – Aizawal – Guwahati
- AAI has renovated Terminal Building, Fire Station Building & Boundary wall following State Govt.'s request
- State Government has reduced VAT on ATF from 18% to 1% as advised by MoCA

Kailasahar Airport

- MOCA & AAI was requested for operationalizing Kailasahar Airport by introducig flights under RCS-UDAN
- State Govt. received 3 proposals from 3 airlines for operation of ATR (17/19 Seater) from Kailasahar Airport:
 - √ Alliance Air : Kls-Kol-Kls
 - ✓ Big Charter : Kls-Agtl-Kls
 - ✓ Spirit Air : i. Kls-Del-Kls ii. Kamalpur-Del-Kamalpur iii. Khowai-Del-Khowai
- Accordingly, MoCA was requested to renovate Runway, ATC Building, Aircraft Apron & other facilities for starting operation of flights
- Hon'ble Minister, MoCA informed (18.09.2023) that it requires Obstacle Limitation Surfaces (OLS) survey, resurfacing of runway & refurbishment of Taxiway for operationalisation of the airport

Kamalpur Airport

- Kamalpur Airport is one of the non-operational airports of the state
- Kamalpur Airport has a total land area of 61.4 acres
- The land is recorded in the name of AAI
- AAI was requested to hand over the land to State Government free of cost or by receiving a token amount
- The land was sought for other commercial development purposes by the State Govt.
- AAI desired and informed (28.03.2023) to retain the lands for development instead of handing over to Govt. of Tripura

Khowai Airport

- Khowai airport is also one of the nonoperational airports of the State
- It has an area o 64 acres recorded in the name of AAI
- The land was sought for other commercial development purposes by the State Govt.
- AAI desired and informed (28.03.2023) to retain the lands for development instead of handing over to Govt. of Tripura

Helicopter – As a part of Aviation

- There is a helicopter Subsidy Scheme reimbursed by MHA in 75:25 basis in the State
- PHL is the Agency for facilitation of service
- Further, State Government sent a proposal to MoCA for construction of 6 heliports under the "Policy for promotion of Helicopter Operation" in 5 Districts: Udaipur, Gomati, Dhalai (2), North & South District of Tripura
- Recently MoCA is requested for construction of Heliport at Sabroom for promoting connectivity, trade & tourism
- Proposed land is recorded in the name of MoCA
