Qcomm data may turn key input for new GDP maths

The government is considering tapping into purchases made through quick commerce platforms such as Zepto, Blinkit, Instamart and BigBasket to understand changes in consumption patterns and pace of economic activity as part of an exercise to revise the base year for national accounts and various other official statistics, said officials. This comes as quick commerce platforms now account for 5-6% of overall household grocery spending in the country, according to some estimates. "We will have to figure out ways to get data from such platforms. We will ask for it but it has to be anonymised," said an official, who did not wish to be identified.

Retail users power up e-Rupee transactions

Mumbai: The Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC), or e-rupee, is gaining traction among retail users, with the Reserve Bank of India widening the scope of participation. E-rupee worth ₹234.12 crore was in circulation as of March 2024, compared with ₹16.3 crore a year earlier, according to RBI data.

Foreign banks urge RBI to relax norms until standoff with ESMA gets resolved

Foreign banks caught in the middle of a regulatory disagreement between European authorities and the Reserve Bank of India have sought clarity from the domestic central bank on certain norms that pose hurdles to a potential alternative model that would allow the overseas lenders to carry on trading bonds and swaps here. While an alternative third-party trading mechanism is unlikely to be implemented ahead of an October deadline for the foreign banks to stop transacting with India's sovereign bond clearing house, the lenders have requested the RBI to relax some rules pending an official resolution of the matter, sources aware of the developments told ET.

Quick-commerce players scaling up 24x7 deliveries as festive season sets in

Quick-commerce platforms are intensifying the expansion of their 24x7 deliveries with the onset of festive season to meet consumer demand even in the wee hours, executives said, aggressively scaling up an experiment they had started to pilot a couple of years ago. "To keep up with the surge in demand during the festive season, Swiggy Instamart has expanded operations across 11 cities in the last two months; the platform will deliver festive needs and other products round the clock," a spokesperson for the IPO-bound Swiggy said. Impulse categories such as salty snacks, frozen foods, chocolates, soft drinks and ice-cream tubs are among the ones ordered through the night, executives said.

The premium motorcycle segment, encompassing bikes above 150cc, is expected to sustain its robust double-digit growth trajectory in the two-wheeler market over the next 2-3 years. This momentum will be fueled by a blend of factors, each contributing to the segment's rising prominence and allure among young buyers. Despite some recovery in the entry-level bike segment, supported by rising rural demand, the premium bike segment continues to outpace overall market growth. Ahead of state elections, all the farm trade measures Centre has announced to placate farmers

India has implemented a series of measures to facilitate the exports of certain farm goods and limit imports of vegetable oils ahead of local elections in two states where farmers form an influential voting bloc. The moves surprised the market, as New Delhi typically tries to protect consumers' interests during the peak festival season. However, this year, it prioritised supporting farmers, setting aside inflationary concerns.

Railways looks to outsource part of maintenance ops

Railways has drawn up a safety upgrade plan that includes training of loco pilots on simulators and outsourcing of some components of maintenance operations, officials said. The move comes in the backdrop of several train accidents over the last two years. The Railway Board has asked all zonal railways to explore the possibility of outsourcing the maintenance of machines used in track renewal operations, according to the officials. Companies pledge Rs 32.5 lakh crore investments by FY30

Indian companies including Adani Green and Torrent Power Monday committed a total investment of Rs 32.45 lakh crore by FY30 in renewable energy, in a big boost for the country's green energy transition. "Developers have committed an additional 570 GW, manufacturers have committed additional manufacturing capacities of 340 GW in solar modules, 240 GW in solar cells, 22 GW in wind turbines, 10 GW in electrolysers," Renewable energy minister Pralhad Joshi said at the Global RE-Invest Summit hosted by MNRE and CII here.

Telecom gear companies fret as draft sourcing rules skip 5G mention

A section of local telecom equipment makers is worried that the draft rules on local sourcing for government procurement of telecom gear do not mention 5G equipment, but the industry broadly believes the proposed rules will bolster domestic manufacturing. The draft guidelines on public procurement with preference to 'Make in India' released by the telecommunications department (DoT) on Thursday has identified 36 products that must have over 50% local value addition while also laying out rules that should be followed for buying these products by the central government and its affiliated entities.

Antibiotic resistance to claim over 39 mn lives in next 25 years: Lancet

Over a million people around the world died annually due to antibiotic resistance between 1990 and 2021, and more than 39 million could die from antibiotic-resistant infections over the next 25 years, according to a global analysis, published in The Lancet journal. Future deaths from antibiotic resistance are estimated to be highest in South Asia - including India, Pakistan and Bangladesh -- where a total of 11.8 million deaths directly due to it are forecast between 2025 and 2050, a collaboration of researchers forming the Global Research on Antimicrobial Resistance (GRAM) Project said.

MEP abolition to boost basmati rice exports, arrest decline in mandi prices

The government's decision to abolish the minimum export price (MEP) of \$950/tonne, which was imposed a year ago, is expected to boost basmati rice exports, bringing India's pricing in line with competitor Pakistan in global trade. This move is also likely to ensure that farmers receive remunerative prices just before the commencement of paddy harvesting, according to rice exporters. Several exporters of aromatic and long-grain rice have urged the government to also lift the export prohibition on non-basmati white rice and the 20% export duty on par-boiled rice. This, they said, will prevent the misclassification or illegal shipment of non-basmati rice, which could benefit from the removal of the MEP on basmati rice.
